#### DIRECTORS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

#### BC COAST REGION CHAIR REPORT – Alex Clarke, Chair

The BC Coast Region has completed full and successful year post pandemic. It is hard to believe that this year was a series of firsts following a 3-year hiatus from any competitions, shows and assessment days. Given the huge obstacles we had facing us, I am so proud of the way our committees, board members and volunteers came together to deliver a season of events for our skaters. We were unsure what to expect, so we approached it cautiously and with patience. A great deal of thought was put towards planning events, keeping in mind financial responsibility, while balancing the need of the skaters and the public heath situation. Overall, 2022-2023 developed into a year of rebuilding and reorganizing within our structure.

The BC Coast Region consists of a group of volunteers who are passionate about skating and dedicated to the clubs in our region. The participation of our volunteers is an integral part of the huge success of our events. The Region delivered two very large competitions this season. Jingle Blades co-hosted with Mission Skating Club and WinterSkate co-hosted with Connaught Skating Club. Both events succeeded our expectations both in registrations and in volunteer participation. I would like to thank both clubs for their involvement and the tireless hours they spent making these events a huge success. It was the first time the Region has offered Live Streaming, allowing viewers to watch from home. With the assistance of the BC/YT Section, we were able to facilitate the successful streaming of a 3-day event on 2 ice surfaces. This has started the ball rolling for further developments at our region competitions, and I look forward to these challenges next season. In addition to our own events, the BCCR also partnered with Cloverdale Skating Club to form the LOC for the BC/YT Victoria Day Super Series Competition held in Surrey.

The Skater Development Committee hosted 2 seminars this season focusing on our Star 1-4 skaters. The Welcome Back Seminar was held at Richmond Ice Centre in September. Over 60 skaters attended to participate in on ice sessions focusing on Freeskate, Dance and Synchro. The Active Start workshop was held between Christmas and New Years at Tilbury Ice in Delta. Over 60 skaters enjoyed learning all disciplines from a series of coaches from the BCCR.

The BCCR continues to provide education, support, and guidance to our clubs through Club Engagement Meetings and in person meetings. Our board members have a diverse skillset and extensive experience which are a huge asset when dealing with our clubs.

I am looking forward to the 2023-2024 season and the ability to continue working with the enthusiastic volunteers and clubs throughout our region.

#### **BC COAST REGION PAST-CHAIR REPORT – Kevin Gordon**

As Past Chair of the BC Coast Region, my role currently is to ensure that we keep track of good contacts and possible candidates for future BC Coast Region Director positions. It is not a huge job, but one needs to keep aware of who is interested, or who might be interested if they knew there was an opening. It seems that for this year our list of nominated candidates matches our current openings, so that means we are in a good state. The list of nominees and those who will take on board positions will be dealt with as part of the AGM meeting.

#### AWARDS COMMITTEE – Lyse Prendergast, Chair

The role of this committee is to oversee the process where BCCR skaters are selected for a variety of Region and Section awards. We are responsible for making these selections according to fair and established criteria, notifying and recognizing the award recipients, and also identifying future opportunities to encourage and support BC Coast Region skaters.

This was a relatively busy year for the committee as we had to catch up on our Awards selection from the past several years. Thank you to Victor Cheng-Tan and Jenny Lum who worked with me to determine the 2021-22 award recipients, who were recognized at the September Club Engagement Meeting.

The 2022-23 committee included Carissa Halley, Jenny Lum and Michelle Towstyka; we received a large number of nominations this year and we were all so impressed with the spirit and dedication of so many skaters in our Region.

#### COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT – Ethan Swinburnson, Chair

A new committee for the 2022-2023 season, we centralized outgoing communications from the BC Coast Region. This included the following:

- Centralization of outgoing communication through constant contact
- Monitoring of bounced and undeliverable emails
- A new draft and approval process for mass outgoing communications

We hope that these efforts have helped to improve communications with clubs and members, and look forward to making further improvements moving forward. If you have not been receiving communications from the region, please <u>let us know</u>.

#### **COMPETITION COMMITTEE REPORT – Ethan Swinburnson, Chair**

The BC Coast Region hosts two competitions each season: Jingle Blades and BC Coast Regionals/WinterSkate.

#### Jingle Blades

Jingle Blades was held in November, 2022 in Mission, BC. The event had 845 entries and lasted for three full days. The BC Coast Region would like to thank the Mission Skating Club for their collaboration towards a successful event – the first "regular" regional event hosted in our region post-COVID-19.

#### BC Coast Regionals/Winterskate

This event serves as a regional championship, with regional STARSkate champions being crowned. This event was held at Minoru arenas in Richmond, BC in collaboration with the Connaught Skating Club. The BC Coast Region would like thank the Connaught SC for their work in delivering a great event for our skaters. There were 901 entries, which made for a huge event.

#### Upcoming Season

Host facilities and partner clubs are currently being finalized for the upcoming 2023-2024 season. These will be communication as soon as available. We are still working towards establishing regular hosting facilities for our events in future seasons.

A reminder to all stakeholders that starting with the 2023-2024 season, the new competition structure will come into effect, with podium pathway categories no longer being offered at region level events. A wider variety of Skate Canada supplemental events will be offered to allow those athletes more opportunity to compete.

#### GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE – Lyse Prendergast, Chair

This committee was tasked with setting up Terms of Reference for the five standing committees of the board (Awards, Communications, Competitions, Governance, Skater Development), and two special committees (HR, Nominations). This process was completed and approved at the July board meeting. The committee also provided support and advice in relation to several issues, including formalizing a standard regional competition Memorandum of Understanding with host clubs and recommending new policies and procedures related to BCCR Board roles.

Many thanks to committee members Carissa Halley, Ethan Swinburnson and Michelle Towstyka, for always being available to consult when issues related to governance arose.

#### SKATER DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE REPORT – Carissa Halley, Chair

The Skater Development Committee was able to successfully run two seminars this past year as we returned to gathering in person after time off during covid. The response from Clubs and Skaters reminds us of the desire for these types of events in the BCCR and encourages us to bring new and exciting initiatives to our region this coming year.

Our Welcome Back Seminar was held on September 11th at the Richmond Ice Centre, where 6 Coaches hosted 34 skaters in STAR 1-4 and 31 Star 5-Gold skaters for a day of on and off-ice training including off-ice jumps, on-ice skills and freeskate and synchro.

Our Active Start Seminar was held on December 29th at the Tilbury Arena in Delta. 5 Coaches guided 70 Star 1-4 skaters through a full day of on and off ice training which included skills, freeskate, pairs and synchro.

A sincere thank you to all our Coaches, Skaters, and the Planning Committee for making this year a success.

#### Data Specialist Representative Report – Lyse Prendergast

It was a very busy year for BCCR data specialists (DS). With the return to a full competition schedule, we were pleased to welcome back several DS who had stepped back during the years of virtual and remote competitions. As well as volunteering at our two regional competitions, many also participated at BC/YT Section events, competitions in other BC regions, provinces and at the national level.

There are currently nine active DS in the BC Coast Region. A clinic was held last summer, and two new DS followed up and achieved their Intro level status – Rebecca Stainer and Gabriella Johnson. Unfortunately, one long-time DS is retiring from the role; Wayne Sutherland won't be returning next season. Wayne has volunteered for many years in the BC skating community in a variety of roles, and we will certainly miss his charm, humour, and experience at the rink.
